At our last Sporting Clay event on February 11th, we had over 90 rounds shot and the Steel Challenge event that was held on the same day had an excellent turn out with the milder weather.

As we look into potential future land purchases, we keep the layout of our facility in mind. Rimfire Challenge

We are thinking about setting up Rimfire Challenge. This is similar to Steel Challenge, however, this is shot with Rimfire (.22Ir) ONLY! Pistol, Revolver or Rifle.

The rules are a little different, Target placement is not dictated and can be 5-7 targets placed no closer than 21 feet.

Scoring is available through PactiScore

The match is to be run using both pistol and rifle by all competitors, two bays for pistol & two bays for rifle.

We will run a hybrid match if you only have a pistol bring that, if you only have a rifle bring that. We don't expect anyone to run out and purchase the one they don't have.

We are still researching, reading and understanding the rules, may need to purchase more steel. MSH

Many ranges will be closed during the setup as it takes several days, please check the Club's calendar before driving out.


Bay 17, behind the garage will be open.

Several members have failed to attend prior to their 2022 renewal therefore you have not been issued your new gate code.


Membership cards are passed out following the Orientation.

Wash attempt earned tickets into a 50/50 pot. There were also 3 beat the trapper stations set up where shooters could place a small wager that they could beat the Manchester Young Guns Trapper. Money entered at these station went into a 50/50 drawing for those that chose to enter.




